


Latino Population Change, DFW Metro 1980-2018






Latino Labor Force Participation, DFW Metro 2018


Self-Sufficiency – Private and Government Sector Employment, Latino and Non-Latino, DFW Metro 2018











- Higher percent attending college




Latino High School and College Attendance, Millennial and Parental Generation, DFW Metro 2018







Age-Adjusted Death Rates, Latino and Non-Hispanic White, Texas 2018




Healthy Profile, Texas 2018

Healthy Babies – Percent Born with Low Birth Weight, Latino and Non-Latino, Texas and United States 2018



- Longer life expectancy




Healthy Profile – Life Expectancy, Latino and Non-Hispanic White, Texas and United States, 2018




