#### What is GDP?

- The total market value of all final goods and services produced in in a particular geographic area in a given year C+I+G+(X-M)=GDP
- A broad measure of economic activity...a nearly universal summary statistic

• Increasing GDP, or economic growth, results in rising wages, higher standards of living and greater economic mobility




# What does GDP reveal about the economic contributions of Latinos living in the U.S.?

- Economic contribution of U.S. Latinos is **VERY LARGE** over \$3 trillion in 2021
- It is also **RAPIDLY GROWING** nearly 2.5x faster than Non-Latino (2010-21)








The 2021 U.S. Latino GDP is \$3.2 trillion


up from \$2.8 in 2020, \$2.1 trillion in 2015, and \$1.7 trillion in 2010





If it were an independent country, Latino GDP would be 5th largest in the world

#### 2021 Latino Consumption totaled \$2.14 trillion


- U.S. Latinos represent a consumption market larger than the entire economy of Italy, Canada, or Russia...


- More capital... physical or human capital

- Better use of capital & labor (increased productivity)







Educational attainment of U.S. Latinos is growing 3.0 times as fast as that of Non-Latinos


The 2021 Latino Labor Force Participation Premium is 6.0 percentage points.


In 2010, Latino's were 4.5 percentage points more likely to be working than Non-Latinos. That premium increased steadily after 2010.






#### If it weren't for Latinos the U.S. population would have declined in 2021


• In that year, Non-Latino population declined by more than 266,000 while Latino population increased by nearly 800,000




#### Latino labor force growth is 9.3x that of Non-Latino from 2010 to 2021





#### Latino real consumption grew 3x that of Non-Latinos from 2010 to 2021

• Impressive growth of Latino consumption is driven by rapid gains in Latino income

#### Latino real income grew 2.5x that of Non-Latinos from 2010 to 2021

• The Latino income growth *premium* naturally flows from rapid gains in educational attainment and strong labor force participation








Prior to COVID, Latinos enjoyed lower age-adjusted mortality across all five leading causes of death






COVID-19 became the leading cause of death for Latinos. Despite significant pandemic-related mortality, Latinos maintained a significant health premium.





# The first two years of the pandemic revealed that Latinos are a critical source of resilience for the U.S. economy

- In 2021, Latinos propelled the U.S. economy with real Latino GDP growth of 7.1%
- Across 2020 and 2021, U.S. Latino GDP was the 2<sup>nd</sup> fastest growing among the 10 largest GDPs

## The strength of U.S. Latino GDP is consistent with the extraordinary growth of Latino incomes

• During the first two years of the pandemic, Latino inflation-adjusted income grew a total of 7.1%, while Non-Latino income declined a total of 1.7 percent

### Georgia Latino GDP






#### 2021 Georgia Latino GDP

- \$52.2 billion of economic activity
  - Similar in size to the entire economic output of the state of Vermont or Wyoming
  - Largest component is consumption which totals nearly \$34.1 billion


#### Atlanta Metro Area

  - 6.1 million people (2021)
- Home to 686 thousand Latinos
  - 23<sup>rd</sup> largest MSA in the nation by Latino population
  - Latinos are 11.2 percent of the Atlanta Metro Area population








Latinos represent a \$25.1 billion consumption market

#### **Contribution to GDP growth**

- Latino GDP is growing more than 3x as rapidly as Non-Latino GDP
- Despite being only 11% of the Atlanta Metro Area population, Latinos are responsible for nearly 19% of Atlanta Metro GDP growth (2018-2021)









Atlanta Metro Latino GDP is growing more than 3x as fast as Non-Latino GDP







# Atlanta Metro Latinos' contribution to growth is 67.9% larger than Atlanta Latinos' population share

• In the U.S. at large, Latinos' share of GDP growth is 49% larger than Latinos' population share







2021 Atlanta Metro Latino GDP

- Largest gains by sector (2018-2021)
  - Finance & Real Estate (gain of three billion dollars)
  - Professional & Business Services (one and a half billion dollars)
  - Information & Technology (one billion dollars)
- **Most rapid gain** (2018-2021)
  - Non-Durable Manufacturing (nearly doubled)





Latinos are making strong and consistent contributions to the Metro Area's population and labor force.

• From 2010-21, Latino population growth was more than 1.7x that of Non-Latinos (32 percent for Latinos compared to only 19 percent for Non-Latinos)





# Latinos are making strong and consistent contributions to the Metro Area's population and labor force.

- From 2010-21, Latino labor force growth was **1.6x** that of Non-Latinos (27 percent compared to only 17 percent)
- Despite being only 11.2 percent of the Metro Area population, Metro Latinos are responsible for 14 percent of the growth of the labor force since 2010







Educational attainment of Metro Latinos is growing 2.2x faster than that of Non-Latinos since 2010







Latino's labor force participation rate was an average of 5.4 percentage points higher than Non-Latino, from 2010-2021





## Latinos provide a very large and positive demographic punch through the formation of households

#### Trends in income growth and household formation extend to homeownership

- The growth of Latino homeownership is nearly 5x that of Non-Latinos from 2010-21
- According to the Federal Reserve's Survey of Consumer Finances, from 2016-19, Latino median wealth increased 60%, compared to only 4% for Non-Latinos.




